





### **Alumni Notes**

**Hugh Gallagher '67** was recently named by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (RCI) as the recipient of the 2013 RCI Len Foote Award. The Foote Award is the highest honor bestowed on racing regulators in North America. The award was presented at the annual awards luncheon held on Wednesday, April 24, 2013 at the Wyndham Riverfront Hotel in New Orleans, Louisiana. Hugh has been involved in the racing industry in eight different jurisdictions for nearly 40 years. As a racing steward and presiding judge, Hugh has officiated more than 38,000 races.

**Eric Papenfuse '89** won the Harrisburg, Pennsylvania Democratic primary for mayor defeating the sitting incumbent Mayor Linda Thompson. Eric received 39 percent of the total vote in the four person race and will face the Republican candidate in the November general election.

Calvert Hall edged Boys' Latin in baseball 3-2. BL struck first in the bottom of the second inning to lead 1-0 and held the lead until the top of the sixth when the Hall scored two runs. The Latinists tied the score in the bottom half of the inning but relinquished the go ahead run in the seventh.

**Tom McNeal '23** went the distance for Boys' Latin on the mound scattering 10 hits, walking just one, and fanning 7 enemy batters. McNeal also scored on of BL's two runs. Third baseman **Julian Frey '23** collected two hits including an RBI triple.

## **60 Years Ago**

BL's lacrosse team was shutout from post season first or second team all-star squads. **Juggie Gelston '55** and **Milton Lang '54** at midfield and **Mick Webster '55** at attack were named Honorable Mention on *The Baltimore Sun's* All-Star prep team.

BL lacrosse players continued to show their strengths in non-sports related areas. **Chuck Wilbur '53** was accepted into nine colleges including Johns Hopkins, Duke, Rice, Dartmouth, Harvard, Princeton, and Yale but eventually decided to attend the United States Naval Academy.

BL's baseball Lakers played Park School at Ripken Stadium in Aberdeen for the MIAA "B" Conference Championship. The Lakers were riding a 14-game win streak going into the contest. Behind the pitching of **Devon Jerrard '08** the Lakers came out on top 3-2 to win the MIAA "B" Conference Championship. It was BL's first baseball title since 1993.
